Tasting notes: bright, spicy, fresh

Turmeric

Tasting notes: buttery, earthy, carrot

AT THE HEART OF DOSELVA ARE SMALLHOLDER FARMERS

Doselva helps these smallholder farmers reach the marketplace by providing resources, financing and ensuring income through contract growing. The raw material is then processed for export in Granada, Nicaragua, building a strong network of economic opportunity and impact.

COFFEE GROWING IN NICARAGUA

As coffee growing in Nicaragua is negatively impacted by climate change, crops like turmeric and ginger have provided farmers—who otherwise rely exclusively on coffee—with options, diversifying their income and building resiliency.

RESTORING HARMONY BETWEEN THE LAND & THE PEOPLE

In order to combat climate change, each farm practices agroforestry—a system in which trees are intentionally planted alongside crops in order to diversify the ecosystem and benefit the environment. Agroforestry is essential to combatting deforestation and rebuilding land and communities.
