# **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

## 4.1. Description of First-aid Measures

### 4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects Both Acute and Delayed

**General:** Contact with gas escaping the container can cause frostbite. May damage fertility. May damage the unborn child. Asphyxia by lack of oxygen: risk of death.

**Inhalation:** Intentional misuse by deliberately concentrating and inhaling the contents can be harmful or fatal. In elevated concentrations may cause asphyxiation, central nervous system effects, and increased breathing rate. ## 7.1. Precautions for Safe Handling
